## **Newsletter Article: "The Power of Acceptance"**

Dear Church Family,

One of the most profound yet often overlooked expressions of Christ's love is *acceptance*. In a world that is increasingly divided—by opinions, by backgrounds, by differences—God calls His people to something higher: a spirit of radical welcome.

Romans 15:7 reminds us, "*Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God.*" This is not a suggestion; it's a call to action rooted in the very nature of the gospel. Jesus didn't wait for us to be perfect before He accepted us. He welcomed us while we were still broken, still learning, still growing.

What would it look like if our church community reflected that same kind of acceptance? It might mean listening before judging. It might mean creating space for people who don't look, think, or speak like us. It could mean being patient with someone who's struggling, without offering easy answers.

This month, I encourage you to practice intentional acceptance. Greet someone new. Invite someone into your circle. Listen without rushing to fix. In doing so, we bear witness to the inclusive heart of our Savior.
